Roseburg To Host Millers Saturday

Roseburg's Indians will have their work cut out for them Friday and Saturday in the opening round of Midwestern League basketball action. The Tribe will travel to Eugene Friday to lock horns in a test of strength with the Sheldon Irish, then will return home Saturday to tangle with the visiting Springfield Millers. Varsity action both nights will start at 8, with the Jayvee games scheduled to get under way at 6:30. The Indians will take a 1-3 record into the league opener—the same record as that sported by the Irish. Springfield opens in league play with a 0-4 mark. Elsewhere in league North Eugene and South Eugene will clash at Eugene's McArthur Court; Marshfield will be at North Bend; Willamette will go to Cottage Grove, and Springfield will be at Thurston Friday. Other games Saturday will find Sheldon at North Bend, Marshfield at Willamette, Cottage Grove at North Eugene and Thurston at South Eugene. Roseburg opened the season with a pair of defeats at the hands of the Klamath Falls Pelicans, then came on to split a home-and-home series with the Grants Pass Cavemen. Sheldon's lone victory is over A-2 Junction City, while the Irish have suffered a pair of setbacks from the Corvallis Spartans and a single defeat from North Salem. Springfield has lost twice to Albany and once each to Thurston and Lebanon.

Glide Dumps Riddle Irish

Recording victories in the first 11 matches, the Glide Wildcats rolled to a convincing 45-8 mat triumph over the host Riddle Irish Thursday in Umpqua Valley League action. The Wildcats boasted decisions in the first five matches, then came on with five consecutive pins before winning the 178-route to take a 45-0 lead. Riddle climaxed the dual meet with a decision and a pin. Pins for the Wildcats were scored by Bob Hadwin at 136 pounds, Bob Damewood at 141 pounds, Tom North at 148 pounds, Craig Long at 157 pounds and Virtis Savage at 168 pounds. David Nearing, competing in the unlimited division, scored Riddle's lone pin. Glide, one of the UVL co-favorites, is undefeated in dual meets this season, with the next meet being against the Myrtle Creek Vikings Jan. 16. In the Jayvee action at Riddle, the Glide crew toppled the host team, 40-23.

Taft Mountain Area Ready For Skiers

The Taft Mountain Ski area, located east of Roseburg, will be open for use by ski enthusiasts this weekend, announce officials of the Edelweiss Ski Club. All facilities will be operating Saturday afternoon and all day Sunday, including ski rentals, the tow lift and the snack bar. Sunday the area will be open from 10 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Reports indicate six inches of packed snow and 12 inches of fresh snow as of Wednesday. More snow is expected. The road to the area has been plowed, but skiers are advised to carry chains. No uphill traffic will be allowed after 4 p.m. The Taft Mountain area is operated by the Edelweiss Ski Club, a non-profit organization. There is a small fee for ski equipment rental and tow rides, with the money being used to repair and replace equipment. To reach the Taft Mountain area travel east on the North Umpqua Highway, turning onto Little River Road just before reaching Glide, then turn left on the 1-mile Road.
