

T. Pargeter Enters Race For State Representative

The first candidate to enter the race for one of the two posts of state representative from Douglas County is Thomas H. (Tom) Pargeter of Roseburg, a Republican.

Pargeter is presently owner-manager of a general insurance business in Roseburg. He is also currently president of the Roseburg Lions Club, past president and present director of the Roseburg Area Chamber of Commerce, an elder in the First Presbyterian Church and member of the Elks, Masons, Scottish Rite and Shrine.

He worked for a number of years with the Umpqua Council of the Camp Fire Girls and was president of that organization for two years. He is a past drive chairman and director of Central Douglas United Fund. He is present secretary of the Douglas County Taxpayers' League and a member of Oregon Tax Research. He has also held the presidency of the Melrose PTA.

Politically, he has been an active Republican campaign worker. Looking to the job he hopes to fill, Pargeter says the people of Oregon face a most serious

The proposed addition to the constitution is listed as Section 1, Article 10: "In the event of dissolution of the corporation, any and all assets of the corporation not then pledged, hypothecated or in any way assigned to a participating agency or to others shall be divided ratably to the then existing exempt agencies on the basis of the percentage of the allocation to the total."
