Klamath Falls' Pelicans and South Eugene's Axemen share first place honors among the A-1 ranks on the weekly Oregonian and Journal prep polls.

The Pelicans, conquerors of mighty Medford, moved to the No. 1 position on the Oregonian poll, while the Axemen held tight to their lead in the Journal poll despite a loss to Thurston.

Coquille's Red Devils, rolling to their ninth straight win, continued to lead both A-2 polls.

Following Klamath Falls on the A-1 Oregonian poll was South Eugene, Central Catholic, Medford, Pendleton, North Eugene, Marshfield, Grant, Sunset and Washington. The Journal poll consisted of South Eugene, Central Catholic, Klamath Falls, Grant, Medford, Sunset, Sandy, Tigard and Marshfield and Pendleton tied for ninth.

Among the A-2 powers Coquille was followed in order by North Catholic, Elmira, Illinois Valley, Heppner, Nestucca, Central, Serra Catholic, Vale and Phoenix in the Journal poll.

Two Douglas County teams were among the A-2 top 10 in the Oregonian poll, with Douglas' Trojans being rated eighth with an 8-2 mark and Myrtle Creek's Vikings rated 10th with a 9-3 record. Coach Tom Keel reports that 25 members of the Roseburg team will make the trip to Medford for the action starting at 2 p.m. The dual meet will be held at the Medford YMCA indoor pool.

Competing for Roseburg will be youngsters between the ages of 7 and 17. The local team practices Tuesday and Thursday evenings between 5:30 and 6:45 at the YMCA pool.

Medford is reported to practice four days a week, and has already been in action in two earlier meets.

UCLA Remains No. 1; OSU Slips To Seventh

NEW YORK (UPI) — Loyola only setback in 12 tests was to UCLA.

Kentucky, beaten by Vanderbilt last week before rebounding to rout LSU and Tulane with 100-plus totals, slipped to fourth. Vanderbilt moved back into sixth-place following its win over Kentucky and a 90-56 pummeling of defending Southeastern Conference champion Mississippi State.

Fifth-ranked Davidson survived a scare from lightly regarded Virginia to remain in the unbeaten class with UCLA and 13th-ranked DePaul. These are the only major colleges with perfect marks. Davidson has won 12 straight, UCLA 13 and DePaul 11.

Loyola of Chicago, the early-season leader, romped to its fifth consecutive victory and replaced Kentucky in the runner-up spot. Michigan also passed the Wildcats to reclaim third place. The Wolverines' Oregon State dropped a notch to seventh and the remaining three top 10 members—Cincinnati (No. 8), Duke (No. 9) and Villanova (No. 10) — remained stationary.

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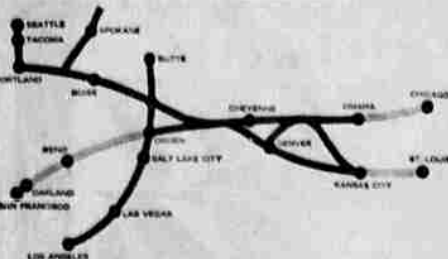
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
