

Pro Cage Stars' Threatened Walkout Works Before NBA All-Star Contest

BOSTON (UPI) — National Basketball Association players resorted to a Teamster tactic to make their point—and they apparently put it across.

A walkout was threatened Tuesday night by representatives of the league's player association just before the start of the NBA's nationally televised 14th annual All-Star game.

Just how many of the 20 top individual stars would actually have refused to play still remains unclear. But even the delay from their discussions brought quick capitulation by representatives of the NBA owners.

The players, headed by association President Tom Heinsohn of the Boston Celtics, met at length with NBA President Walter Kennedy. Several hours later, it was obvious that Kennedy and Heinsohn still were issuing conflicting statements, but no matter how you read them they sounded like a clear cut player victory over the nine-man board of governors.

The dispute delayed but did not otherwise affect the All-Star game and the East went on to a 111-107 victory over the Western All-Stars before a near capacity Boston Garden crowd.

Cincinnati's Oscar Robertson, named the games most valuable player, tossed in a game high of 26 points and contributed 14 rebounds and eight assists to the ninth Eastern victory in the 14 attempts.

The West got only a single first-half point from unanimous star team selection Walt Belamy. The West could have blamed the Baltimore star's travel difficulties which delayed his arrival until shortly before game time.

Instead, Western team Coach Fred Schaus of Los Angeles insisted the "man who hurt us most was (referee) Sid Borgia. We missed too many foul shots in the first half but Borgia's miscalls hurt us more."

Boston Celtic pilot Red Auerbach, who was scoring his ninth All-Star coaching victory in ten starts, said the East victory stemmed from "unselfish play."

The Celtics' Sam Jones had 16 points to rank second for the East.

Cincinnati's Wayne Embry, Philadelphia's Hal Greer and Boston's Bill Russell had 13 points each to back Robertson's pace setting effort. Russell in addition collected 21 rebounds.

For the West, Wilt Chamberlain of San Francisco and Bob Pettit of St. Louis netted 19 points each with 20 and 17 rebounds, respectively. Jerry West and Elgin Baylor of Los Angeles had 17 and 15 points in that order.

Nick Kozak, Destroyer Clash In Main Mat Event Saturday

Roseburg wrestling fans are in for a rough-and-tumble exhibition Saturday when Nick Kozak and The Destroyer clash head-on in a non-title bout at the Douglas County Fairgrounds.

Kozak earned the right to meet The Destroyer by defeating Tony Borne two weeks ago before the local fans after the masked "meanie" had won the Northwest heavyweight crown from Maurice "Mad Dog" Vachon the preceding night in Portland.

However, The Destroyer refused to put up the heavy weight belt, claiming that Kozak has "no reputation."

The Destroyer is a tough customer in the ring where he utilizes his full 240 pounds to punish the opponents. He is reported to be an ex-collegiate football and wrestling star who shows amazing agility for his weight. The Destroyer's pet hold is the figure four toe hold, and he is offering \$1,000 to any wrestler that can break it.

Kozak will be outweighed by 25 pounds as he pits his famed airplane spin against the rugged tactics of the Northwest champ. However, the popular Canadian will be out to prove that despite his "lack of reputation" that he is more than a match for the tough masked marvel.

In the semifinal bout Irish Paddy Barrett will tangle with Art "Boom Boom" Mahalik, a former all-pro linebacker with the Pittsburgh Steelers and the San Francisco Forty Niners. The opening match will find Dirty Don Duffy meeting Abe Jacobs, the new Zealand speedster.

Promoter Elton Owen reports that the matches will be held in the exhibit Building at the Douglas County Fairgrounds in order to provide additional seating capacity. The first match will begin at 8:30 p.m.

Reserved seat tickets are now on sale at J. C. Sporting Goods in downtown Roseburg. Additional reserved seat tickets and general admission tickets will be sold at the gate the night of the bouts.

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
