GIRLS' TENNIS CLUB ADMITS NEW MEMBERS

Officers of the girl's tennis club for the current year are: Marian Stowe, president; Edith Woodcock, vice-president; Maude Beals, secretary; and Mildred Bagley, business manager.

The officers were elected at the meeting last Wednesday at which the question of enlarging the club was also considered. As tennis is compulsory for every woman in the University it was decided to admit any girl to membership after she had become proficient in Dr. Stewart's estimation. The membership dues in the club are 25 cents in addition to the 25 cents which every co-ed pays toward keeping up the court. The club now numbers about 25 members but as the girls are taking up tennis enthusiastically it is expected to grow rapidly.

The club proposes to agitate for a concrete court that will permit playing between showers in the winter, and also to have an indoor court laid off in the gymnasium when it is turned over to the women.

Hereafter the University will maintain the campus courts though the club will control the management. Six rackets have been purchased for the use of beginners.

Dr. Stewart, the new women's physical director is a tennis enthusiast and is doing all possible to popularize the game among the women of the University.

PROFESSOR SWEETSER LECTURES TO Y. M. C. A.

Professor Sweetser delivered an interesting lecture before a mass meeting of the young men of the University of Oregon, in McClure Hall, Friday night, on "The investment of a Life," dealing with the development, influence and economic value of the home mission work in the slums of the large cities of the United States. A series of stereodwellers and slums of variousCMFWY opticon views, showing typical slum dwellers and slums of various cities, and giving a graphic idea of the extent of the evil and the beneficial effect that the mission movement has already had toward remedying it, gave an additional feature of interest to the address.

The hall was filled with an attentive audience of between seventy-five and one hundred young men. Music for the occasion was furnished by the male quartette of the Y. M. C. A., Messrs. Geisler, Rounds, Downs and Quigley.

It has been decided by those in charge to call the meeting next Friday at ten minutes to seven, and to devote the time until seven o'clock in singing the songs of the Varsity, for the benefit of the new students who are still unfamiliar with them. The meetings will be adjourned promptly at eight o'clock.
