EDUCATION WILL BE THEME OF TEACHERS

Two Educational Conferences are
Scheduled at University Dur-
ing Commencement

Two educational conferences will be held at the University during commencement week. Prominent superintendents and teachers from all over the state will be gathered to listen to the programs and discuss educational matters.

The first conference, to be held on Monday and Tuesday of commencement week, will be composed of the county and city superintendents of the state, together with the faculty of the University. The general upbuilding of the educational system in Oregon will be under discussion at this meeting. The project of union high schools will be given special consideration. This is a live topic in educational circles and one in which the University is specially interested. One object of the meeting will be to bring together the superintendents and to get them better acquainted with the University.

The second conference, composed of the high school teachers of the state, will be held on Thursday and Friday of the same week. This is a specially opportune time for this conference, as many of the alumni who are teaching in high schools return to the University for commencement. Methods of teaching English, science, and some other subjects will be talked of in this meeting.

LIFE OF BUSINESS MAN DISCUSSED AT Y. M. C. A.

Dr. Schmidt Shows How Business
Life Can Be Made One of
Usefulness

"The Life of the Business Man," was presented last evening at Men's Meeting in Deady Hall by Dr. A. C. Schmidt, a successful banker of Albany, and president of the state Y. M. C. A.

He took as the basis of his address that the only worthy aim that a man should have in his life is the establishment of the best and strongest character, and he showed how, in doing this, the individual carries out all the principles of Christianity. He asserted that because Christ lived the most perfect life that has ever been lived, we can do no better thing than try to equal the perfection of His life. Taking as a basis for life this idea, he showed how the business man has an opportunity to develop his own life along this line and to influence other men to do the same thing. He asserted that the opportunity of the business man is equal to that of any of the professions and in many respects better, for making his life count for helping those about him.

Following the address, the annual business meeting was held. President Dalzell called the newly elected officers to the front and after indicating the duties of each, surrendered the chair to President Koyl, who will direct the Association for the coming year. Mr. Koyl appointed the following committee: Walter Huntington, Bible Study; Claris Sweany, Mission Study; Edward Bailey, Membership; Harold Quigley, Meetings; Harvey Slater, Social. The reports of the chairmen whose terms have just closed, were read and accepted.

The last of the series of Life Work Meetings will be given next Friday evening when Judge Harris will lecture on "Law as a Vocation."
