BENNETT PRIZE OFFERS REWARD TO ESSAYISTS

Interest On \$400.00 Paid for Essay on Economics

The Bennett prize is the annual income of \$400.00 given to the University of Oregon by the late Philo Sherman Bennett, to be invested, and the proceeds used for a prize for the best essay discussing the principles of free government. The following rules will govern the contest:

1. Limits in length of papers. The committee considers that two thousand words should be the minimum. It sets no maximum limit.

2. Date of filing papers. The papers of the contestants for the prize shall be filed on or before the third Monday in May, with the Registrar. A pseudonym should be used on the paper, and a sealed envelope containing the true name for pseudonym should accompany.

3. Form. The paper should be typewritten, and on paper uniform with that required for the Senior thesis.

The committee shall have the right to withhold the award if in its judgment no paper worthy of the prize is submitted.

The following additional regulations to be observed by contestants were made last year:

1. The criterion of reference must be specific—the title of the volume and number of page referred to should be given in marginal note or foot note.

2. The essay should be in good literary form.

3. The subject selected must be so restricted in scope as to secure pointed and intensive discussion.

The following subjects have been suggested—others may be chosen by the contestants:

1. The next step for Oregon, politically.

2. The effect in detail of the present tariff rules upon the budget of an average family.

3. A student's criticism of our public school system.

4. The correlation of direct legislation with representative government.

5. Factors in the University that make for leadership.

Any student in the University is eligible to contest for this prize. The prize has not been awarded for the past two years, but it is hoped the essays this year will be of sufficient excellence that it may be awarded.

The sum is loaned out at present in Eugene at four per cent interest, and whether the \$48.00, including the interest which accumulated the past two years, will be awarded to the deserving winner of this year, or whether \$32.00 will be added to the principal, making the annual income at four per cent \$17.40 thereafter, is the momentous question which confronts the faculty at the present time.

The subjects for this year will be posted on the bulletin boards by Prof. Young very shortly.

Norman Hackett, who for two seasons was the star of "Classmates," and who is well remembered for his brilliant work in the classic drama with Sothern and Marlowe, Louis James, and other eminent stars, has been especially engaged by the Shuberts to play the leading role in "The City," Clyde Fitch's sensational drama, which ran all last year at the Lyric theater, New York, when it is presented at the Eugene Theatre on October 25.

A course in the conservation of resources is offered at the University of Michigan. Six years are required in completing the course, and the degree of Master of Conservative Engineering is given.
