**Michi Kawaii Makes Effective  
Plea for Foreign  
Missions**

Michi Kawaii, a Japanese missionary and teacher, gave an intensely interesting talk last evening in the Women's Gymnasium, to the girls of the Y. W. C. A. and their friends. Miss Kawaii, who is a native of Tokio and a graduate of Bryn Mawr College, is visiting friends in the West, and at the request of the Territorial Association of the Y. W. C. A., is giving personal lectures, educational as well as religious, to the girls of each college of the Northwestern states.


Her magnetic enthusiasm, charming foreign accent, and delightful witticisms held both the heart and the ear of the listener as she compared the cramped and narrow life of the Japanese to the wholesome freedom of our American girl. She proved that even though education, styles and customs are different from those of the Japanese, that in the Christian religion nationalities are merged.

Her appeal was for material aid for the Christian organization in Japan which corresponds to our Young Women's Christian Association, and was generously responded to by pledge subscriptions, made under the supervision of Mrs. Clarke, Secretary of the Advisory Board. Mrs. Clarke announced that she will gladly receive or collect all the money thus subscribed, and she desires that it be paid before the close of the college year.

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## ENGINEER WRITES OF CROWDED CONDITIONS

**Structure Completed Last Year  
Offers But Temporary  
Relief**

As an evidence of the need of more funds for buildings, we need but visit the class rooms and the fact is plainly brought out. Take, for instance, the classes in the engineering department. A new building was completed last year to care for the increase in the department, but even now it is too small. The class in structural mechanics is over three times as large now as it has ever been. Not only is the student denied the individual attention from the instructor, but laboratory periods have been shortened and decreased in number. Heretofore each student had the use of the testing laboratory three hours per week; now they have but two hours per week, and have to skip every third week. It is very evident that some of the work is missed entirely, or else skipped over hurriedly. This is the fundamentally course in engineering practice, and should be the most thorough.

Other courses, such as graphic statics, surveying, drawing, concrete, hydraulics, etc., are seriously handicapped because of over-crowding and lack of adequate laboratories.

The people of this state wonder why it is that the graduates of the state institutions do not have the standing that the graduates of our neighboring state schools have, but fail to see that a large part of the difficulty is their unwillingness to spend a dollar or two each for the proper equipment of their own colleges. Plans are formulated for the enlarging and improving of the departments, which plans are delayed only by the lack of sufficient funds.

## INTER-CLASS STRUGGLE BEGINS NEXT WEEK

The girls' inter-class teams for the Hayward cup will begin next week. They will be played every afternoon between five and six o'clock in the men's gymnasium, but nevertheless all men are tabooed.

The schedule is being prepared and will be announced later in the week. Each of the captains is very anxious that every girl in her class make an especial effort to be out for practice, as everybody who either knows the game or is ambitious athletically is needed, and will have a chance to play. None of the teams are as yet chosen. Each class will have a team and each team will play each of the other three. The elimination method will not be used in these games, but the championship will be determined upon a percentage basis.
