**DR. HINSON DELIVERS
ABLE ADDRESS TO Y. M.**

Nearly Seventy-five Present to
Hear Brilliant Portland
Speaker

The address given by Dr. Hinson at the Y. M. C. A. meeting in Deady Hall last evening just before the oratorical contest was heard by nearly seventy-five men.

The subject of the talk was "The Projected Life," in which the speaker brought out very emphatically by many unique illustrations and phrases the value of the life lived for the good of society. For twenty-five minutes he held the room full of men, many of whom were obliged to stand, at the closest attention by his tersely expressed truths and touches of humor. His address was especially appreciated because, although he began ten minutes late, he was thoughtful enough to quit right on the minute and the guarantee of the Y. M. C. A. that these weekly meetings shall close at ten minutes to eight was strictly kept.

The report of the nominating committee which was appointed a week ago was made. Earl Jones was nominated for President, Elliott Roberts for Vice President, Edward Himes for Treasurer, and Vernon Motschenbacher for Secretary.

**MONMOUTH WILL ENTER
THE 1912 ORATORICALS**

Executive Committee So Decides
and Elects L. L. Hope
President

Next year Monmouth Normal will take part in the Inter-Collegiate Oratorical Contest; and the man who receives a majority of first places will be declared the winner, even though he might not win the decision under the existing system of marking. These things were decided by the meeting of the delegates from the various state colleges held Friday afternoon, besides electing L. L. Hope, of Pacific, President for the ensuing year, and was the only business of importance transacted outside of the usual routine work.

The amendments to the constitution of the association were as follows: "Each judge shall mark the oration he considers best 100, and the others according to their relative merits, providing that no one is marked below 75." "At the close of the contest the executive committee shall canvass the grades and mark them 1, 2, 3, 4, etc. The orator ranked first by four or more of the judges shall be awarded first place. If no orator is thus ranked first, the orator the sum of whose ranks is least shall be awarded first place. In case of a tie, an average of the two rankings shall be made on the basis of percentage."

The amendments were introduced by the Oregon delegation, and received but faint opposition. Monmouth Normal was formerly in the association, but has not entered men for the past two years, but entered a petition this year for reinstatement. This request was granted with the provision that her orator be chosen from members of its Junior and Senior classes. The other classes are now of college rank.

when it deems advisable; and to decide questions that may come up from time to time.

Sec. 7. Appeal from the decisions of the Governing Board to the league can be made at any time.

Sec. 8. Organization and election of officers shall be held on March first of each year. All elections and decisions shall be by a majority vote, except as stated in Article III, Section 2.

ARTICLE V.
Section 1. Regular meetings shall be held every two weeks. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President upon the request of three members of the league.

ARTICLE VI.
Section 1. Amendments may be made to the Constitution and By-Laws by a two-thirds (2-3) vote of the league.

**BYLAWS
ARTICLE I.**
Section 1. Robert's Rules of Order shall govern this league in all applicable matters consistent with the Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE II.
Section 1. A schedule of games shall be played each spring between teams representing each fraternity and club in this league. These games shall be played off according to a regularly arranged schedule, which schedule shall be drawn up and agreed upon by the Board of Directors.

Sec. 2. The winner of this schedule of games shall be awarded the "Gregory Midnight Doughnut Cup" by the league upon the completion of the schedule. This trophy is to be permanently retained by the fraternity or club first winning it twice in succession. (It is hereby agreed that the time effected by this section shall date from the presentation of this trophy in 1909.)

Sec. 3. When the present trophy has been permanently won, another trophy or cup shall be provided in such manner and means as the league may see fit.

Sec. 4. Three umpires shall be chosen by the Board of Directors to officiate
