As this revival of interest in forensics and our recent victories have occurred since the advert of Mr. Buchen, it is c ly fair to accibute to him a large share of the credit. As much as any successful athletic coach, he deserve the appreciation and the support of the student body for his valiant efforts in placing us in the position of pre-eminence we now enjoy, and for awakening interest in this most important branch of college activity.
