SURVEYING CLASSES TO COMPLETE AHEAD OF TIME
 By Next Week Engineers Will Be Free So Far as Plane and Topographic Survey is Concerned

All students in plane and topographic surveying have been doing double class work during the last month and a half, so that the semester's work may be covered by the end of this week.
 All class work of both courses is finished and the class in topographic surveying took its examination last Friday afternoon. Owing to the unfavorable weather conditions, the field work, consisting of three periods of astronomical practice, has not been completed. The class in plane surveying will take their examination Friday night of this week. There are four field periods yet to be completed, but all the work is planned and will be completed by the end of next week.
 The reason for the hurry is that the instructor, Mr. Carl McClain, has received a fine offer of a position for the summer work, and as the condition is that he report for duty before the middle of May. All his work is compiled, so he will be allowed to go.

Mr. McClain is to have charge of, in the capacity of general superintendent of a dam, canal and power plant for the Silver Lake Railway & Lumber Company, near Castle Rock, in Washington. The plant is to develop about 1000 horse-power and the preliminary work has been done and plans drawn by the Pacific Electric Engineering Company, of Portland.
 Mr. McClain will have charge of the construction of the entire project and will plan all detail work. He expects to complete the work during the summer and return in time for class work in the fall.
