stitute therefor the words "The Graduate Manager."

Sec. 3.—Insert the word "Graduate" between the words "the" and "manager."

Glee Club. Art. II. Sec. 1.—Strike out the words "provided that the manager must be ratified by the Executive Committee" and after the words "elect its own officers" insert the words "except the manager, who shall be the Graduate Manager."

Strike out Sections 2 and 3 and substitute the following. Section 2. All money accruing from concerts and concert tours shall be deposited with the Treasurer of the Associated Students within one week after the last concert.

Article III.—Strike out the words "manager of the Glee Club" and substitute therefor the words "the Graduate Manager."

Article IV.—Strike out the words "manager of the Glee Club" and substitute therefor "The Graduate Manager."
