## NEWS FOUND IN THE WASHINGTON DAILY

Coach Dobie Says His Men Have a Chance to Win.—Band May Play at Game.

Arrangements for bringing the University of Washington delegation to the Oregon Washington football game next Saturday, are now nearly complete. The only thing which is not yet settled, is whether the Washington cadet band will accompany the rooters or not. At a meeting of the Board of Control last week, it was decided not to appropriate any money to send either the band or a yell leader, but the proposition has gone into the hands of the students, and with \$8.00 already contributed, it is expected that necessary \$150 to cover expenses can be secured at this week's assembly. The Washington band is composed of thirty members this year, and will be quite an additional feature at the big contest.

Washington is working hard to secure a delegation of at least five hundred to take the trip to the Rose City. A special train will be run from Seattle on Saturday morning, and a rate of a fare and a third will be given to be good for return on any line until Monday, November 20. The rate will go into effect as early as Thursday, and in case the students favor it, the special may be run Friday evening. Sixty students had already signed for the trip by last Friday, and the list had just been started. Special rooter's practice will be held at the Seattle institution to work up a series of stunts at the game. The Washington football team will leave Seattle Thursday evening at four o'clock.

Coach Dobie was authorized by the board of control last Wednesday to take twenty-two men to Portland in case he needs them. The authorization was made because of the significance of the Oregon contest to the Washington football management. Should the northern institution lose to Oregon, it would spoil the W. S. C.-Washington game on Thanksgiving as a drawing card, and in order to fortify against every possibility of defeat, the Board of Control gave the Washington coach the privilege of using the extra men. The proposition of sending the yell leader was also taken up at the meeting, but the board held that the Associated Students of the University of Washington were too poor to send even a cheer leader, let alone the student band.

"The element of luck will have a great deal to play in the Oregon-Washington football game Saturday, the single flip of the ball on a forward pass may decide the Northwest conference championship." This is the way Coach Gilmour Dobie of the Washington football eleven sized up the coming gridiron struggle in an after dinner speech last Thursday night at the Tau Tau Kappa banquet at the Washington Annex.

"The Oregon team will outweigh Washington fourteen pounds to the man," Dobie continued. "I know this to be a fact."

"Now as to the scores which were given out before the O. A. C.-Washington contest, I gave out just what was given to me. The men who sized up our men and the O. A. C. team, overestimated the strength of the Oregon men and underestimated our strength. I went entirely on what they told me."

"The dope on the Oregon game, as I myself know, is that we have a chance. That is all—just a chance. In football there is a great deal of luck, and it is on this element of luck that I give Washington a chance. I never have been very far off in guessing the score when I know the team. The big trouble here has been that I have not been able to study our opponent as I used to be able to do in the Middle West."
