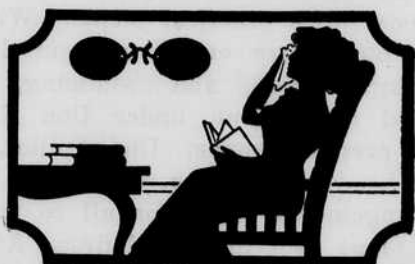

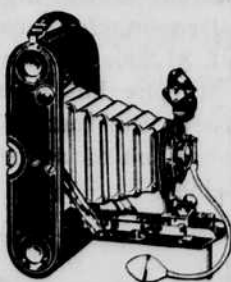

**FACULTY GIVES OUT
 SCHEDULE FOR EXAMS**

Ordeals Will Start June 10th—Two-Hour System Will Again Be Used.

Copies of the examination schedule for the second semester have been posted on the various bulletin boards throughout the different buildings, and are being largely eagerly consulted by the anxious ones. The two-hour examination, which proved so successful last February, will again be used this semester. With the exception of freshman English composition, which is to be given from 10 to 12 A. M., on Saturday, June 8th, the examinations will all be held during the five days from June 10 to June 14.

Faculty Action May Give Release.
 No examination will be given earlier than the regular examination schedule, without faculty action, and no examination will be released from its scheduled time, unless conflicts compel, in which case it will be placed at some time later than the time regularly scheduled.

Four o'clock classes in 1 and 2 hour subjects may be examined from 3 to 5 P. M. on any desired day.
