Ira Courtney, the University of Washington sprinter, entered the record breaking class last Saturday at the Olympic tryouts, when he negotiated the 110 meter race in 10 4-5 seconds, equaling the world's record held by Walker, the South African sprinter.

Byron Houck, the ex-Varsity pitcher, finished a game for the Athletics Tuesday. Connie Mack worked him after St. Louis had knocked two regular twirlers out of the box.

The Pacific Coast is lamentably weak in broad jumpers this year. Allen, of California is the only consistent performer. His best mark in the Olympic tryouts was only 22 ft. 6 in.

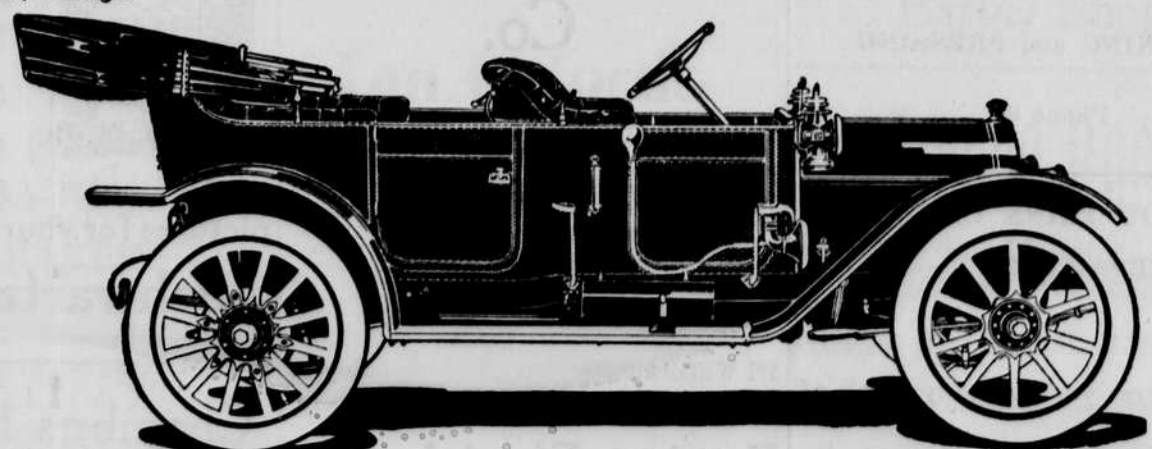
