Rumored Change to Quarterly Is Not
Upheld by Manager
Cake.

Manager Ralph Cake, of the Oregon Monthly, announces that the first issue of the magazine for the current year will be ready for distribution about October 16th. Preparations for publication have been practically completed, and a vigorous campaign for subscriptions is planned.

The staff of the Monthly has been weakened considerably by the absence of Wm. Cass and Miss Esther Grissen, associate editors-elect. However, Miss Dunham, the editor, has filled the vacancies by appointment, having selected several assistants in the various departments. As a result the following staff personnel is announced: Literary, Nellie Hemenway, with Leland Hendricks and Lloyd Barzee, assistants; Art, Bess Cowden; Margaret Rankin, assistant; Verse, Lucia Macklin; Engineering, Al Davies; Exchange, Lyle Steiwer, assisted by Katherine Carson and Jessup Strang.

Manager Cake, when interviewed concerning the rumored change of the Monthly to a Quarterly publication, said: "It is true, that the project has been under discussion, but no active step has been taken, and we are making no deviation from the original plans for the year's work. Unless some unforeseen event occurs, the first issue, under the old name, will appear in about three weeks."
