System Before the Supreme  
Court.**

Hon. George Fred Williams, who will speak to the men of the University next Wednesday evening, under the auspices of the Wilson Club, represented the State of Oregon before the United States Supreme Court, when the validity of the Oregon system was assailed by the Pacific Telephone Company, last year.

Mr. Williams, who has spent several years in both the United States Congress as representative from Massachusetts, and in the State Legislature, has been campaigning for the Democratic ticket ever since the real campaign started, having traversed the entire Middle West and South.
