Entering the contest with betting odds three to one against them, the O. A. C. eleven took the aggressive and literally swamped their northern opponents in the mudcovered field.

Washington was the first to score, with a drop kick by quarterback Young after the ball had been placed upon the Aggie 16-yard line by a series of lucky runs. From that time until the final touchdown by Washington, the odds were always in favor of Dolan's

Blackwell Ties Score.

In the second quarter, by spectacular work, the O. A. C. backs succeeded in keeping the ball almost continuously in their opponents' territory, 13th ST. MEAT MARKET which enabled Blackwell to try for several place kicks, and finally succeeding in putting one between the goal posts and tying the score. All of Dobie's fancy dancing and clever contortionist stunts, including the famous Highland Fling and the reverse handspring, were of no avail against the spectacular team work displayed by the Dolan eleven. The Washingtonians won simply by chance.

Blackwell was the shining star for the Aggies, but he was closely seconded by May at tackle, Christian at center, and Evendon, the veteran full- EUGENE, back. For Washington, fullback Jacquot and quarterback Young were Bakery: Fourteenth and Mill,.

"Systems of public accounting as a step towards attaining highest efficiency in the affairs of municipalities, counties, and the state, will be made the subject of another conference. The organization of municipal markets and of farm credit associations will also be promoted under the auspices of the University.

"Furthermore it is believed that a comprehensive development of Oregon's power resources and the general application of electricity upon the Oregon farm will be hastened through a discussion that elicits general cooperation of all parties concerned. Other matters of quite as vital interest will be taken up.

"The motives underlying this University movement are the ideal and spirit of commonwealth service, largest utilization of scientific procedure and the purpose to bring about the co-operation of all representations of all interests."


