The Collegiate Alumnae of Portland have for several years maintained a scholarship in the University of Oregon. In conclusion, Miss Guppy described some very effective work the organization is doing in Tacoma, her former home. Oregon women will not be eligible to this organization until the establishment of a building purely for women on the campus.


