The fact that the amendment raising the student fee from five to eight dollars was adopted unanimously hows that the stacents are alive to he advantages accruing from such an arrangement. Under the present dent Body has decreased $\$ 1,200$, leaving a debt of only $\$ 800$ for next year With the advantages of the new sys tem there is no reason for not expect ing next year's administration clear away the debt entirely.
The whole affair goes to show that ny problem can be solved expeditiusly and satisfactorily as soon as he students get behind it and give it their interest and support. ENCORE!
