UNIVERSITY WOMEN TO ACT AS A UNIT

CO-EDS NOW ORGANIZED IN
FORM OF LEAGUE

Limit Likely to be Placed on Honors
One Girl Can
Carry.

At the suggestion of Miss Guppy and the Women's Council, a mass meeting of all the women of the University was called April 24, in order to form a Women's League. The Women's Council conducted the meeting and it was decided by unanimous vote to form the league. The officers had been previously nominated by a committee from the Women's Council. Other nominations were also made at the meeting.

The chosen officers are: Eleanor McClain president; Meta Goldsmith, first vice president; Faye Ball, second vice president; Hazel Tooze, secretary; Minnie Poley, treasurer; Ellen Van Volkenburg, sergeant-at-arms, and Evelyn Harding, editor.

The purpose of the league is to promote acquaintance, unity and loyalty among its members, both active and associate, and to be a medium by which the social standards of the University can be made and kept high.

To make it possible for the women of the University of Oregon to investigate subjects of general improvement with facility and thoroughness and to inaugurate any of the work which may be deemed advisable by the executive and advisory committees.

The membership will be both active and associate. Active membership is open to all women of the University. Associate membership includes all the Faculty wives and the women of the Faculty.

The League is governed by majority vote, but the work of the association will be carried on between meetings by certain committees.

The first of these, the executive committee, consists of the president, first and second vice presidents, secretary, treasurer, the heads of all the women's organizations, and heads of all general committees.

The second committee is the advisory board, which consists of associate members elected by the executive committee. There will also be special committees over each department.

The officers of the League are the president, first vice president, who is also chairman of the social committee, the second vice president, who is president of the Women's Athletic League, secretary and treasurer, sergeant-at-arms, and editor. The first three are to be elected from the Senior class, the secretary and treasurer from the Junior class, and the sergeant-at-arms and editor from the Sophomores class.

It is expected that the point system, as used at the University of Wisconsin and other large Universities, will be adopted by the association. By this system each girl is allowed to carry only a limited number of points at a time, each office counting a definite number of points.

The group system of committees, with one Senior over ten Freshmen girls, will also be adopted by the League. It is expected that these committees will also promote a closer friendship and unity between the classes.

The first official action of the organization will be the tea given to the visiting women on Commonwealth Day, at Mary Spiller Hall.
