New Varsity Fraternity Will Petition Delta Upsilon

Iota Chi, the latest fraternity to organize at the University of Oregon, will petition the Delta Upsilon fraternity next fall for a charter as a chapter at the University. Iota Chi, the fraternity whose origination is clouded in mystery, has risen rapidly in college circles since its conception last Thanksgiving.

Delta Upsilon was formerly known as the non-secret fraternity. From its organization in 1834 until 1884 it claimed that its meaning was known to all. The fraternity was organized at Williams College, Massachusetts.
