## ROME A FILTHY CITY

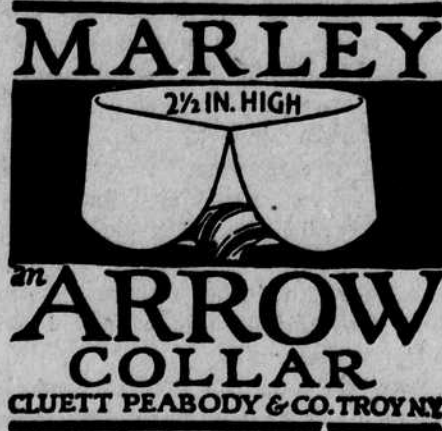
Professor Dunn Plans Lecture to Show
