

# EDUCATION INSIGHT SAYS DR. S.A. ELLIOTT

Son of Harvard's President Thinks  
World Is Not Becoming Com-  
mercialized

Dr. Samuel A. Eliot, President of the American Unitarian Association, of Boston, lectured Thursday at 4:00 o'clock in Professor Howe's room in Deady Hall, on "The Real Meaning of Education." Dr. Eliot is the son of President Emeritus Charles W. Eliot, of Harvard University.

"Education seems to me the acquisition of that power to put, as it were, a candle within the things that we see, and make them glow with a celestial light," stated Dr. Eliot. "The real meaning of education," he continued, "is the turning of sight into insight; that which seizes upon the right points. Some see the facts and others see what the facts stand for. Isn't that, down at the bottom, the difference between the educated and the uneducated man. Education means something a good deal more than an accumulation of facts. It has to make facts live."

Dr. Eliot, in his talk, repudiated the statement that someone has made, that everything has been commercialized; that the world has been disenchanting. In proof of the repudiation he told of the thousands of people who, each year, visit the humble birth-place of Robert Burns. "Robert Burns did not corner the market in necessities, or invent a labor-saving machine, or do any other great practical feat; he was merely a song writer," said Dr. Eliot.

"In the giving and receiving of knowledge, I pray you not to forget that, the deeper meaning, what you are really about, is turning sight into insight," said the speaker. "Of course I'm not for a moment going to depreciate the scientific habit; I was brought up in it. But there are depths of human nature that cannot be weighed or measured or subjected to chemical tests."

# SEDUCTION DOUBTED

Story that Oregon Students Tempted  
Aggie Statue from Garden of  
Eden is Discredited

After a thorough investigation, the Administration Department has been unable to connect any of the Oregon students with the theft of the bronze statue from the O. A. C. campus at Corvallis last Monday night.

President Campbell states that the O. A. C. authorities believe that the theft was not the work of Oregon students, but the work of someone living in Corvallis or attending the Agricultural College.

The light and power company has gone over the line from Albany to Corvallis and have not been able to find any cause for the lights going out in Corvallis Monday night. The line inspectors have not found any signs of a cut wire as the cause of the sudden darkness.

Late Monday evening several automobiles filled with men were seen in the neighborhood of the O. A. C. campus, but there is no clue pointing to their identity or to the fact that they were the ones who stole the Aggie's statue. The general opinion here is that the crime is not the work of Oregon students. If Oregon students had taken the statue, it would probably have been decorating the Oregon campus Tuesday morning instead of being back in its place on the "historic fountain."

The O. A. C. Barometer editorially lays the blame of seduction on "Aggie rooks."

President Campbell believes the Oregon students are innocent. He has interviewed several of the students and has been unable to find anyone who knows about the incident. He said this afternoon that he thought
