Every alumnus and active member of the local chapter of Sigma Nu, the first men's fraternity to be established at the University of Oregon, will receive the Emerald at least once a month. Many of the men are already subscribers, but the local members of the fraternity are so anxious to keep all their alumni fully in touch with the campus that they have decided to make certain that none are overlooked by sending nine or ten issues yearly to the whole list.

The paper sent each month will be one of the issues containing an alumni section.

Nine men secured a charter from Sigma Nu and founded the Oregon Chapter in 1900. One of these men, C. A. Redmond, died April 13, 1903. The other eight have been prominent in Oregon affairs. Clarence Bishop is manager of the Pendleton Woolen Mills; C. A. Payne is a real estate dealer in Ashland; E. N. Blythe is head of the copy desk on the Portland Oregonian; Richard Shore Smith is a member of the law firm of Woodcock & Smith, Eugene; Condon C. McCornack is a captain in the medical corps of the United States Army, with headquarters at Manila; Fred J. Zeigler is city physician of Portland; C. N. McArthur is United States Congressman from Oregon and was speaker of the house of the Oregon legislature in 1913.
