REGENTS MEET APRIL 10

Final Action Will be Taken on Building and Expansion Plans for University

The Regents of the University will meet in Villard Hall Saturday April 10. Final action on extensive building and expansion plans for the University during the coming year will be taken up at this meeting, which is an adjourned session from last month. A committee composed of Judge Hamilton, W. C. Newell, A. C. Dixon, J. A. Churchill and Milton A. Miller, was named at that time to go over the extensive recommendations of the President.

This committee met two weeks ago to prepare its report. At this meeting it was announced by members of the Board of Regents that approximately \$50,000 is to be set aside each year for buildings, and that the recommendations of the President will in the main be adopted.

The President's recommendations to the Board of Regents involve the employment of 18 new instructors and professors, the expansion of the Schools of Commerce, Architecture and Journalism, and the complete organization of a Law School in Eugene. All members of the Board of Regents are expected to be present Saturday.
