## 'GOLF DAY" IS SCHEME OF BERT L. PRESCOTT

#### Would Have All Men of University Putting the Holes and Greens in Shape.

There are successful dollar-days, dress up-days and apple-and-raisin-days, and Bert L. Prescott thinks the University might have a golf-day. The idea isn't to convert everybody to golf in 24 hours, or to have everyone on the campus play the game that day, but to get all the able-bodied University men out, say on a specified Saturday, to help put in shape the golf course southeast of the campus. And right now, Mr. Prescott says, would be a most appropriate time to have golfday, before Christmas vacation, after which basketball petitions and exams may be distracting attention.

Regents Appropriate \$50 The board of regents has appropriated \$50 for the golf links, but this will cover only the cost of the oil and sand, ac

cording to Mr. Prescott. The labor will

have to come from the student body. "There are two plans for securing the labor that have been considered," says Mr. Prescott. "One is to ask the men's fraternities to donate the labor. The objection to this is that the fraternity men do the work, other men will be reluctan. to use the course. They will feel that they have no claim on it. The other plan is to ask the student council to appoin: a committee of nine which with a faculty member will be responsible for putting the nine holes and nine greens in shape. Each committeeman would solicit seven or eight men to help him, and if each or these put in two or three hours' work the links would be ready.

Dorm. Men Work

"If some Saturday morning could be set aside, and everyone come with his tools prepared to work, the whole thing could be put through."
