The Junior prom, the biggest event of the spring in the social world of the University, will be formally opened at 8:30 by the grand march led by Frank Scieffe, president of the Junior class, and Ruth Roche. Good fellowship rather than the money spent on decorations is featured.

Two punch rooms are needed this year on account of the attendance of over 400. These rooms are decorated with tall white vases filled with pink and white flowers and placed on white stone pedestals.

A chain of ivy is festooned around the side of the balcony, with smaller vines hanging from the edge and through all, electric lights are intertwining. Artificial red flowers on apple twigs—5000 of them—cover the three-foot siding of the balcony. Large lemon-yellow "O's" two and one-half feet high are placed every thirty feet on this background.

The stage of the armory is built up to represent an inverted green bowl, the center back of which is decorated with a yellow "O," ten feet high. From this stage after the eighth dance the men's glee club will sing. After the third the women's glee club will sing from the balcony.

Medals to the athletes will be presented by Lamar Tooze after the sixth dance.

Hendershott's 10-piece orchestra is furnishing the music for the twelve dances. The programs are of white, on which the Oregon seal is gold-embossed.

A new method of admission has been adopted by Smith, Holyoke, Vasser and Wellesley colleges, to go into effect Sep-tember, 1919, it was announced last week.
