ADRIENNE EPPING, WINNER

Takes Finals of Annual Tournament From Roberta Killam.

Adrienne Epping won the women's tennis championship of the University Thursday afternoon when she took the finals of the annual tournament from Roberta Killam in two straight sets.

The first set in the match was close and hard fought. Miss Killam won the first game, Miss Epping won the second, tying the score. The former then took the next three games easily making the score 4-1; however that marked the turning point in the match. Miss Epping took the next five games straight winning the set 6-4.

The second set was not so close, although nearly all the games ran into deuce. After the first two games the score stood 1-1; Miss Epping then won the next four games; Miss Killam took

the fifth and Miss Epping won the last, making the set 6-2 and winning the championship.

The whole match was marked by steady even playing on both sides and the only advantage gained were by head-work and careful placing of the ball. Miss Epping won most of her decisive points by drawing Miss Killam up to the net and then lifting the ball over her head on a strong back hand lob. Miss Killam made several brilliant, near professional, net plays. Paul Bond who watched the match and who has followed the tennis history of the college for at least 10 years says that this season's team is the strongest the women of the University has ever had.

Besides winning the tennis title and the Henderschott racquet Miss Epping also holds the Laraway cup for one year.

Miss Hazel Rader, of the gymnasium department refereed the games. She is well pleased with the tennis prospects this season and predicts an ever stronger team for next year.

OREGON CO-EDS TRIM AGGIE TENNIS TEAM

U.-O. Players Win Easily From O. A. C. Girls in Three Straight Matches.

The University co-eds trimmed the Aggie women's tennis team in three straight matches this morning.

Adrienne Epping playing for the lemon yellow won two straight sets from Genevieve Frazier, the O. A. C. women's champion.

Miss Epping won the first game in the singles match in each set, Miss Frazier the second, tying the score. Miss Epping then won four straight games, bringing the score to 5-1; Miss Frazier then nosed up to 5-3, then won the next game in both sets making them each 6-3.

Roberta Killam and Frances Baker played the second match for Oregon, winning from Ruth Carlson and Marjory Crittenden 6-0, 6-1.

The third match was hard fought and the issue was doubtful up until the very last point. The sets were 6-3, 3-6, 7-5, Oregon winning.

The last set was marked by especially good playing.

Miss Carlson of O. A. C., starred for the Aggies. Miss Killam and Miss Epping won their decisive points on heady placing in far corners of the court.

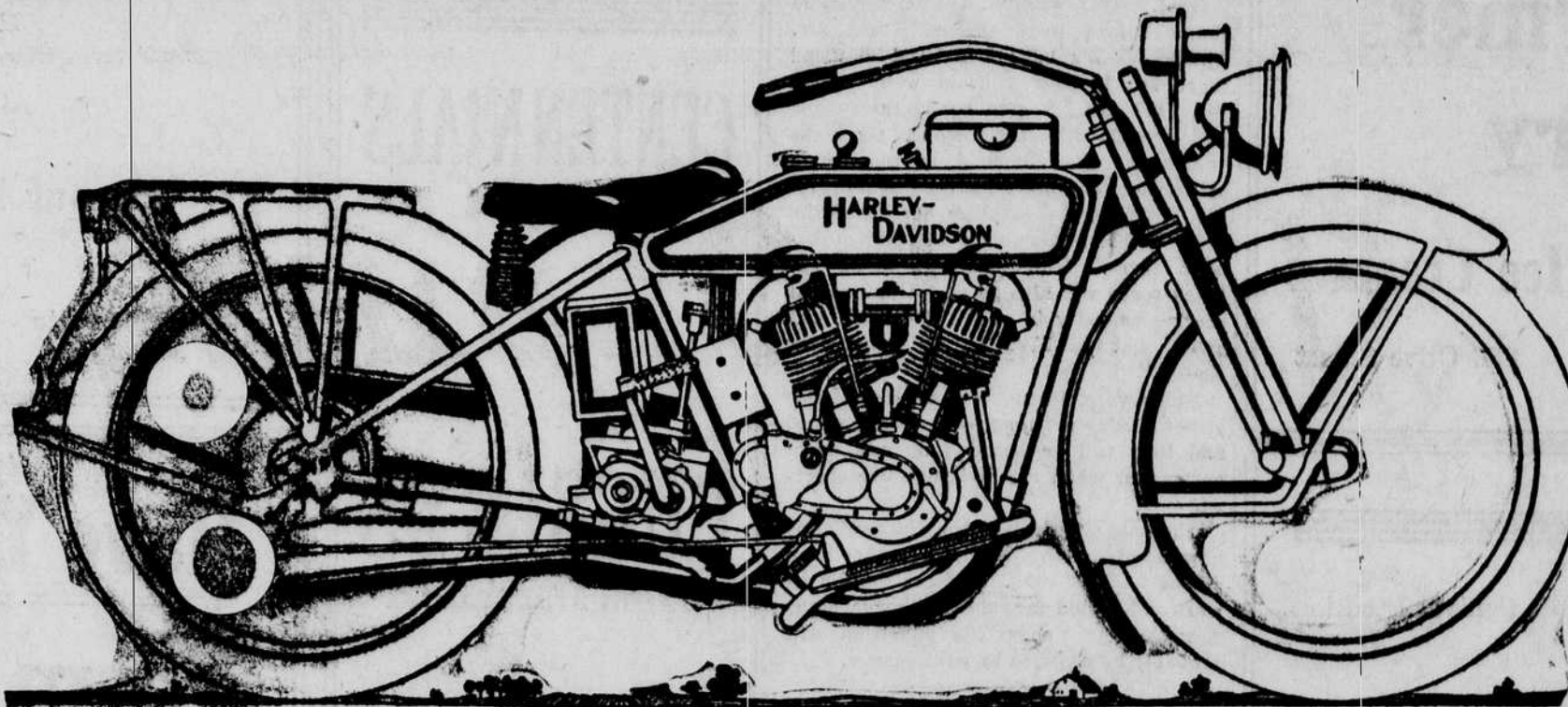
