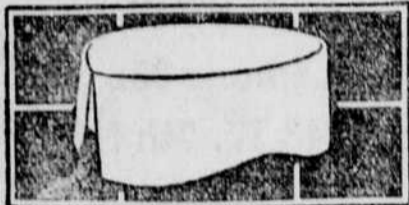

In a Class by Itself

BAD WEATHER KEEPS GIRLS' GYM INDOORS

Organized Games and Baseball Replaces Outdoor Work Till Rains Stop.

Swimming Exhibition Today. Baseball and Track Practice Begin.

On account of the unsettled weather, the girls' work in gymnasium will be confined to the two gymnasiums for the next two weeks, or till the rains are over, according to Miss Cummings, head of the department of physical education.

The advanced students in tennis will be allowed to play in the outdoor gym while the beginners in tennis, those enrolled in golf, canoeing and archery will report to classes as usual and have organized games and baseball practice.

Serious practice for those interested in baseball will also be held and this will continue throughout the season. This will be separate from the class work.

Swimming classes are to be divided according to ability. There will be six periods two afternoons a week where groups of ten girls will be under the direction of the teachers and where they will receive practical instruction. The groups will be divided into three classes—elementary, average, and expert swimmers. This afternoon the University girls swimming team gave an exhibition meet for the benefit of those who were not able to see the meet with O. A. C.

A track team composed of girls especially interested in competitive work is to be organized as soon as possible and later in the spring. On field day this team and other girls interested in running and jumping will hold a track meet.

COURSES TO FIT MEN FOR OFFICERING DUTY

Final Schedule to Be Prepared Tonight; Drill and Instruction to Be Offered.

Classes and Hours Will Be Talked Over in Meeting in Villard Tomorrow.

The announcement of courses that will be open to men preparing for places in the army as officers, as well as courses designed to fit men for places as officers in the University companies, will be made at assembly tomorrow morning. The entire hour will be given over to a discussion of these courses and the determining of schedules.

A meeting of the heads of departments involved, as well as the instructors who will probably give courses under the new compulsory drill system inaugurated yesterday by the faculty, will be held tonight to continue the work of outlining courses. Those who will require special preparation in technical subjects will aid in the determining of courses required if they will consult with the members of the faculty in whose department the work would naturally fall. At the present time the entire affair is unsettled because the faculty do not know the amount or the nature of the work required as preparation for federal army examinations.

The assembly will be addressed by President Campbell, Hugo Bezdek and Dean Eric W. Allen. "It is the aim of the meeting" said Karl Onthack, secretary to President Campbell, "to outline to the men of the University the larger field of service which is open to them." In accordance with the sentiment of the general army staff, the men will be shown that an equal chance for service lies in

MEN READY FOR CALL

Coast Artillery May Be Turned Out on Short Notice.

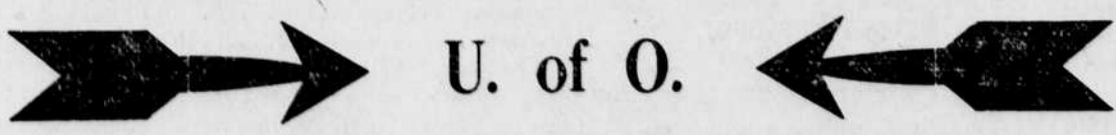
