PROGRAM IS READY FOR COMMENCEMENT

Failing - Beekman Oratorical Contest First Event.

President L. R. Briggs of Radcliffe to Deliver Address to Class.

The forty-first annual commencement of the University, June 1-4, begins with the Failing and Beekman oratorical contest which will be held in Villard hall at 8 p. m. Thursday, May 31, and will be followed at 9:30 by a serenade concert on the campus by the men's glee club.

On Friday, June the first, in the evening the commencement play, Shakespeare's "Midsummer Night's Dream" will be given on the campus. The seniors and juniors will hold their peace pipe ceremonial at 9:30 p. m.

Saturday, June 2, is the big day as far as number of evenings go. At 9 a. m. there will be a meeting of the state alumnae association in Guild hall. The State alumni association will have their meeting in Villard hall at 10:30 a. m., with a special re-union of the classes of 1907 and 1892. The University dinner to alumni and invited guests will be held in the men's gymnasium at 12 m., and will be followed by the President's reception at 5 o'clock at the President's home. At 6:30 the flower and fern procession will be held, and at 7:15 the twilight concert on the campus by the women's glee clubs. The alumni reunion and ball will take place in the men's gym beginning at 9 p. m.

The Baccalaureate sermon will be delivered on Sunday at eleven by Dr. E. H. Lindley, professor of psychology at the University of Indiana. At 4:30 the Sacred concert under the direction of the school of music will be given in Villard hall.

The Commencement address will be given by LeBaron Russell Briggs, president of Radcliffe College in Villard hall at 10 a. m., Monday June 4.

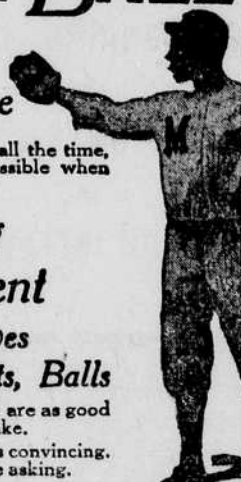

REGISTRATIONS FRIDAY

Only Lane County Students to Sign Up With Sheriff.

Listing Outside Men for Con- scription to Be in Hands of Committee.

Registration for the conscription bill will start Friday morning at 8 o'clock at the Registrar's office. Dean Eric Allen and Karl Onthank, secretary to the president will have charge of the registration.

"All students of the ages covered by the conscription law, living outside of Lane county, should report to the registrar's office Friday," said Mr. Onthank. This is being done to avoid mistakes in registration.

It is necessary that every male in the United States should be registered before June 5. After the student has registered here at the University he will send his card to his home county sheriff and will receive in return a card showing that he has registered. "In case there is any doubt as to where to register go to the committee and get their advice. The students cannot af-

(2) a naturalized citizen? (3) an alien? (4) or have you declared your intention of becoming a citizen? where were you

born? if not a citizen, of what country are you a citizen; trade, occupation or office; by whom employed and where; have you a father, mother, child under 12, or a sister or brother under 12 solely dependent on you for support (specify which)? Married or single; race; military service, rank, branch, years, nation or state; do you claim exemption from draft and on what grounds?

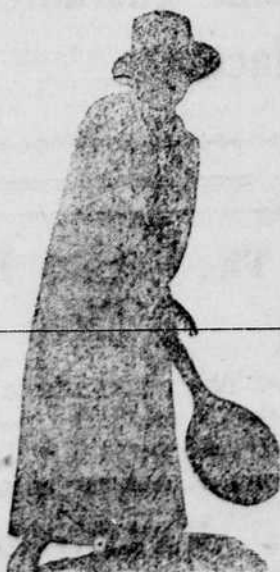
