

FROSH MADE ELIGIBLE

Can Play in All Sports in Northwest Conference.

Meeting at Spokane Reaches Decision—Oregon Not Represented.

Freshmen will be permitted to play on Varsity teams according to a rule adopted by the Northwest intercollegiate conference at its annual meeting held in Spokane yesterday. From now on first-year men may engage in all forms of intercollegiate competition.

This rule will probably not effect Oregon as the Pacific Coast conference decided to continue the one-year rule and

Idaho is the only college outside of the Coast conference which Oregon will meet.

The conference will make out its schedules for the spring sports and football also at a meeting today. Oregon, Washington and O. A. C. did not have delegates present at the meeting yesterday.

Eligibility rules were drafted with respect to men in service. It was decided that a student returning from service might immediately be eligible to participate in athletics. The conference may decide to eliminate either track or baseball but the decision will go over until today.

Professor M. F. Angell of the University of Idaho was re-elected president of the Northwest Conference and Mr. Bohler of W. S. C. re-elected secretary.

Delegates from Whitman, W. S. C., Idaho and Montana were present at the meeting.

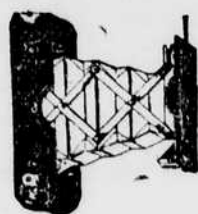

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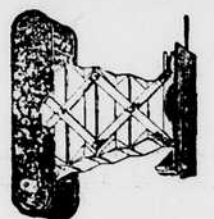
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
