



Believing that the value of co-operation has been brought out in the present war, Dr. Alvarez thinks that co-operation between individuals and nations in time of peace must be also established to secure a firm organization of international relationship.

Individual Rule Eradicated. In regard to the reconstruction of international law, the American institute asks that the three principles of the Monroe Doctrine be promulgated.

"These principles represent not only the interest of the United States, but the interests of the whole American continent," stated Dr. Alvarez.






