Fees other than the incidental fee that is, laboratory, locker and other fees, must be paid at the comptroller's office between the fifth and fourteenth day after the study card has been filed. A latter paymen involves the payment of a late payment fee of \$1.00. Failure to pay within 35 days automatically suspends the student from the University.

### Credentials Wanted Early

New students registering at the university should be sure that their credentials have been sent to the registrar's office in ample time so that there need not be any delay in obtaining their card of admission. "It sometimes happens," said Mr. Spencer, "that a student comes to the university thinking that his credentials had been sent in when either through some misunderstanding on the part of the student or the high school, nothing has been done."

It is absolutely necessary that the signature of all the instructors be obtained before turning in the study card. All laboratory fees should also be filled in.

After all other signatures are obtained, return to your major professor, make out a duplicate study card for his file, have him look over your card and see that it is correct, and have him sign it. The major professor in ever case must be the last one to sign the card.
