More than six hundred persons will participate in the annual musical
festival to be held under the auspices of the School of Music the latter part of May. Three complete performances in which both professional and amateur talent will take part will be
given. The festival will be presented in three parts and a children's cantata in which five or six hundred from the Eugene schools will participate will head the program at the first night's performance. The
