department at Syracuse University. Dur. ing this period his department grew from 73 to over 600 students.
Dr. Parsons founded andedirected the university settlement, run in connection with the department of sociology of the university. He is regarded as an able apeaker on economic, political and socia Eorrope and the Orient to study socia conditions.
