

BOXING MAY BECOME CONFERENCE SPORT

Question to Be Taken Up at
Next Coast Session.

108 MEN IN COURSE NOW

Oregon to Pick Team From
Efficient Class

Owing to the possibility that boxing may become an activity supported by the student body as an intercollegiate sport, more interest is centering in the boxing classes now maintained at the cost of the school of physical education.

At the meeting of the Pacific coast and Northwest conferences during the Christmas holidays, the question of forming boxing and wrestling conferences will be taken up, and from the information that can be obtained at present it is believed that Oregon will enter in both of the conferences in case they are formed.

Schedule May Be Made.

If the plans to form these conferences are completed at this time a definite schedule will be made and the boxing and wrestling classes will be necessary in these phases of athletics.

At present there are 108 men of the University enrolled in the boxing classes under the instruction of Charles Dawson. He has been instructing largely in the rudiments of the game since the first of the college year. After warming up at the beginning of the class period with calisthenic exercises the men are given a few general instructions and then paired off in order that they may put what they have learned into actual practice.

Advanced Class Formed.

Several men in the classes who have worked especially hard or have a quantity of natural ability have been put into a separate class. Because of the limited size of this class each of the men in it has the opportunity to work out with Mr. Dawson. They are given harder workouts but in consequence are getting more out of the class. It is from among this class that men will be chosen to represent Oregon in case she enters the conference. The following men are at present on the roll: Burnette, Merrifield, Martinson, Andre, Beck and Dodds.
