## ACCOUNTING COURSE INTERESTING MANY

### Income and Excess Profits Tax Case Large Demand for Skilled Men.

"It is our aim to make the accounting department one of the best in the west," said Professor McDougle of the school of commerce in discussing future plans for the accounting branch of commerce. He said that the overcrowded condition at present made it rather difficult to carry on the work as successfully as he wished it might be. According to the professor, there is an unusual interest being shown in the work this year. He said that the income tax and the excess profits tax had caused an unusual demand for accountants and that this was probably one reason for the interest shown.

"We expect to give every one who takes any accounting at least a general knowledge of the work so that he may be able to use it in whatever business he may take up," continued Prof. McDougle. "and we will attempt to make expert accountants out of those who expect to follow accounting as a profession."

## LIBRARY WILL HAVE BETTER VENTILATION

### Dr. Bovard and Miss Robertson Find Way of Keeping Air in Building Fresh.

Dr. J. F. Bovard, Dean of the School physical education, and Miss Robertson, University nurse have been investigating the ventilation in the library and have found a way in which they think that the air in the library can be kept fresh. The temperature which facilitates study is about 65 degrees. The electric fans are found to have a greater effect when the windows near them are closed. If the windows are open the fresh air

is forced out of the room as soon as it enters and is wasted. The fresh air will enter through the front doors and the windows in the back of the library which will be open. The fans will be kept running all of the time.
