The temperature which facilitates study is about 65 degrees. The electric fans are found to have a greater effect when the windows near them are closed. If the windows are open the fresh air

is forced out of the room as soon as it enters and is wasted. The fresh air will enter through the front doors and the windows in the back of the library which will be open. The fans will be kept running all of the time.
