

HERMIAN CLUB PLANS TO PRESENT FRIEZE

Three Sections In Bas Relief to Deck Women's Building.

The Hermian club, organized of upperclass majors in physical education for women ordered its gift to the women's building last week. The present plan is to give three sections of frieze in bas-

relief picturing the ideals of the teaching of physical education. Miss Mabel L. Cummings, Miss Emma Waterman and Professor A. H. Schreff have been chosen by the girls as a committee to select the design.

"We plan," said Ruth Wolff, president of the Hermian club, "to establish a precedent, and hope that the members of the club in coming years will follow our example in presenting something which will add to the beauty and dignity of our new women's building."

For this reason, the idea of the frieze was chosen. The first sections will be purchased by the charter mem-

bers of the club and can be added to from time to time by future members.

Money Raised Through Work.

The physical education majors have already raised through their own efforts a \$1,000 contribution to the building fund. Various methods have been used to obtain money, among them being classes for children in folk and aesthetic dancing, gymnasium classes for women, massage and corrective work. The "pound," to which all careless women in the department contribute regularly has also been a source of income — the small fines for redeeming gymnasium clothes as well as the sale of middies,

bloomers and shoes which are left unclaimed and unidentifiable in the lockers at the close of school in the spring. This fall approximately \$100 was raised in this manner.

Thus, the \$1,000 pledge has been raised, but the girls are going to continue to add to their fund, which will be spent in beautifying the new home of the department.

"It is our idea to show to some extent that we are appreciative of the fact that we are getting such a wonderful building for our department," said Miss Wolff.

Miss Cummings, head of the depart-

ment and honorary member of the Hermian club, feels very much pleased that the girls have decided to spend their money in this way. We feel, she said, that something permanent and beautiful will be of great value to our department. Mr. Fisher, superintendent of grounds, has done much, said Miss Cummings, toward the beautifying of the campus with trees and flowers, and the physical education majors intend to do as much in their new home. Miss Cummings is doing a great deal towards helping the majors in their new enterprise. The balance left in the Hermian club treasury after the payment of the \$1,000

pledge will be added to from time to time throughout the year. Little is being done at present, but as soon as the women's building is completed, classes in dancing, and gymnastic work will be organized, massage and corrective work given to swell the fund which will mean so much to the department.
