Friendly Hall slipped up on the blind side of Sigma Nu with a 11-10 victory; Bachelordon drubbed S-Maralda 27-5; and S. A. E. marched off with the spoils of a 16-7 score, against Delta Tau Delta, yesterday afternoon in the indoor gym.

The Fiji-Owl game was featured by spasmodic spurts, first from one side and then from the other. In the first five minutes of play both sides hung tough, but after the initial warming up period, Knudsen, Fiji forward, slipped away for the first count. The fight was on, both sides opened up and a mad swirl ensued. The 1000 per cent Fijis were rushed to the limit in maintaining their top-notch position. Not once were they able to leave the dexterous Owls far enough in the rear to put them out of danger.

Throughout the S. A. E.-Delta Tau Delta contest the former had the upper hand due to their good floor work. Kays and Moore were their big point getters, Kays making 7 and Moore 6. Base and Beaver, forwards for the Delts, played up to their usual good form, Base annexing 5 points.

In the first five minutes of play between Bachelordon and S-Maralda the score favored the latter, but later the Bachelors took the lead and increased it rapidly until the game ended. Black, the victor's star guard, played a stellar game from first to last adding 9 points to their score.

A tit-for-tat struggle was that staged between Friendly Hall and Sigma Nu. In the second half of the game the dorm men overcome the lead held by their opponents, by one point.

DR. WILLIAMS TELLS ALL ABOUT VITAMINES

Chemical Nature and Importance To Life Explained to Members of Science Club.

Vitamines—No, they have nothing to do with minerals, but they are quite vital mines, according to Dr. Roger Williams of the chemistry department who addressed the Science Club on the subject "Vitamines and Their Relation to Growth and to Health" Tuesday evening in the lecture booth of Deady hall.

First of all, a vitamine is a substance aside from proteins, carbohydrates and fats that is a necessary part of food for the body, and second there is a probability, as pointed out by Dr. Williams, that an insufficient quantity of vitamines may lead to premature old age and to a lowered resistance to disease, and that this danger may be avoided by a proper choice of foods, which should include plenty of milk, dairy products and leafy vegetables.

Dr. Williams gave a part of his talk to a brief description in history of the vitamines, and showed what a person needs in the form of food stuffs chemically, including these substances. He has done a great deal of research work on the subject of the vitamines, and discovered a new biological test for the so called "Vitamine B" in which the growth of yeast is utilized. This test is being used by various investigators, including Casimir Funk, the originator of the "Vitamine Hypothesis."

He explained the relation of the vitamines to the growth of experimental animals such as rats, to the growth of yeast as applied to human nutrition, and illustrated this part of his lecture by some pictures of experimental animals, and some yeast colonies.
