Higher Standard Sought.

Theta Sigma Phi, national honorary journalism fraternity for women and Sigma Delta Chi for men are active in promoting interest in journalism. Sigma Delta Chi meets every week to discuss matters of interest to its members and to help to raise the standard of journalism in the University. Theta Sigma Phi recently gave \$50 toward the work of the National Occupational Bureau which is maintained by the national fraternity to help journalists secure positions. The work of the bureau is not limited to members of Theta Sigma Phi however but seeks to bring together employer and employe in any line of journalism. The bureau has as patrons and patronesses some of the best known writers in America. On the University campus, Theta Sigma Phi seeks to promote interest in journalistic work of the highest order, frequently holding open meetings for the benefit of other students as well as its members.

Art Students Busy.

Art and architecture students have three organizations, the Architecture Club, The Texon Art Club and the University Builders League, all actively engaged in encouraging the work of the department.

Two forensic honor fraternities, Tau Kappa Alpha for men and Zeta Kappa Psi for women are doing much to promote interest in forensic activities on the campus. Tau Kappa Alpha gave the cup that is awarded to the winners of the inter-fraternity debates each year. Both organizations have for their object the raising of forensic standards at the University.

Three commerce fraternities, Alpha Kappa Alpha for men and Zeta Kappa Psi for women and Phi Theta Kappa for men, seek to raise the standard of scholarship in the department of commerce and to promote the general welfare of students in the department.

Education Is Encouraged.

The Women's Education club seeks to encourage work along educational lines among its members. The local chapter of Phi Kappa Delta seeks the same thing among the men. On February 19, they are to become a part of the national organization of Phi Delta Kappa and will be known as the Phi chapter.

Two language clubs, one for students of French and one for those interested in Spanish are encouraging their members to do superior work in these languages and also to arouse interest in the life and customs of France and Spain.

Two law fraternities, Phi Delta Phi and Delta Theta Phi are doing much to raise the scholarship and professional standards of law students. Phi Delta Phi led all men's organizations on the campus in the grades for the first term this year.

Better Literature Aim.

Ye Tabard Inn Chapter of Sigma Upsilon is seeking to encourage literary activity among the men of the University as are Pot and Quill and the Eutaxian society among the women.

The Condon club is the Oregon chapter of the Geological and Mining Society of American universities. It is composed of students interested in geological study and investigation and especially encourages work in the investigation of the geological history of Oregon.

The University Players and Mask and Bushin afford opportunities for students interested in dramatic work to have actual stage experience and training of the highest order.

Social Side Promoted.

Various honor societies are endeavoring to promote scholastic and social advancement among the students. To-Ko-Lo is for sophomore men, Kwama for sophomore girls, Friars for senior men, Scroll and Script for senior women and Torch and Shield is an honor society for men. The University Honor Society is made up of students who have high scholastic standing and has for its object the securing of a national Phi Beta Kappa chapter for the University. Cross Roads is a society to promote honor scholarship and research.

Tre Nu is a society of partially or wholly self supporting girls of the University. It serves to bring them together and encourage individual activity.

The Industrial Forum is a discussion group of girls interested in the problems facing women in industry. The Historian Staff is working to collect data in regard to the history of the University and to preserve it for the future.

The Oregon clubs for both men and women are composed of students who are not affiliated with any social fraternity. The organizations promote good fellowship and social activity among their members.

Religious Groups Meet.

The Y. M. C. A. and Y. W. C. A. are doing much in the way of organizing classes, discussion groups and in aiding students in every way possible. Religious clubs are also active; the Newman club for Catholic students, the St. An-

draws club for Episcopalians, the George Elliott club for Unitarians and the Christian Science club for the students who are members of the Christian Science church.

The Inter-fraternity council and the Pan-Hellenic Council work among the various fraternities. The Cosmopolitan Club seeks to encourage acquaintance and exchange of ideas among students who represent the different nations of the world.

The Washington club is a new organization and is composed of all students who live in the state of Washington. They endeavor to become acquainted and to organize for social activity.

Masons Are Organized.

The Craftsmen club is composed of students who are Masons. Sigma Alpha is an honorary society of pre-medicine students. The Hermian club is made up of physical education majors and is endeavoring to raise the standard of work in this department as well as in all departments in which its members are interested.

The Home Economics club is also a new organization and as yet has hardly finished the work of organization. It has for its object the promotion of the work in home economics and is raising a fund to be used for a practice house that the department hopes to have in the near future.

Plans for organization of several more clubs are under way and local honor fraternities are working for national charters.

CLUB TO INVESTIGATE CHINA.
