

OREGON GETS COAST TENNIS TOURNAMENT

Tentative Agreements Made With Five Colleges.

From all indications, a Pacific coast conference tennis tournament will be one of the athletic features of the coming junior week-end, according to Marior McClain, graduate manager.

Tentative agreements for the meet have been received from Washington, W. S. C., Stanford, California and O. A. C., and unless the unexpected happens, the affair will be staged as scheduled.

An annual Pacific coast conference tennis meet is a new feature in college athletic circles. The plan in the past has not been clearly defined and no permanent action taken to insure an annual staging of this event.

An all-coast affair was held last year sponsored by Stanford, but Oregon did not send a team because each college must finance its own representatives. As the previous tournaments have followed in the wake of the coast track meets Oregon is sponsoring the event this year.

Because the affair does not come under the regular conference jurisdiction which is exercised over the major sports each annual meet is usually left to the college holding the coast track meet.

With the coast tennis tournament, the coming junior week-end program will present a varied array of athletic activities. The coast conference track meet will, of course, hold the limelight of all the athletic events, while the tennis tournament and the two-game baseball series with O. A. C. will also come in for their share of attention.

It is quite likely that some freshman athletics will be scheduled and there is a probability of some inter-collegiate sports for the co-eds.

tion paid their regular dues as prescribed in Article X of this constitution. The Treasurer shall be given at least one week's notice of election.

Article VIII. Graduate Manager.

Sec. 1—Election. A Graduate Manager shall be elected by the retiring Executive Council within two weeks after the regular election of the Associated Students.

Sec. 2—Qualifications. The Graduate Manager shall be required to give bonds of three thousand dollars (\$3000) within fifteen days after his election. The Executive Council shall have the power to remove the Graduate Manager from office.

Sec. 3—Assume Office. The Graduate Manager shall assume the duties of his office on the first day of June.

Sec. 4—Control. The Executive Council shall have direct supervision over the Graduate Manager in all athletics, forensic and other student body activities.

Sec. 5—Powers and Duties.

Clause 1. General Duties. The Graduate Manager shall have the management of all student body activities. He shall perform all duties that usually appertain to the office of manager, including the scheduling of all contests, concert trips, purchasing of supplies, and shall sign all contracts on behalf of the Associated Students to which the Associated Students shall be a party.

Clause 2. The Graduate Manager shall be a non-voting member of the Executive Council and the finance committee.

Clause 3. Appointing Assistants. The Graduate Manager shall appoint such student assistants as he may desire, subject to the ratification of the Executive Council.

Clause 4. The Graduate Manager shall assist the finance committee in the preparation of the annual budget.

Clause 5. Reports. The Graduate Manager shall:

(a) Report to the Executive Council at such times as it may demand.

(b) Make a final report to the student body before the end of the school year.

(c) The Graduate Manager shall present a complete financial report to the Executive Council of each game, concert, concert tour or contest within one week after each game, concert, concert tour, or contest shall have been played, given or held.

Clause 6. Disposition of Moneys. The Graduate Manager shall within one week deposit with the Treasurer of the Associated Students all moneys accruing from each game, concert, concert tour or con-

test, from subscriptions, and from advertisements.

Clause 7. Approval of Bills. The Graduate Manager shall approve in writing all bills contracted by him.

Article IX. Elections.

Sec. 1—Officers Elected. The President, Vice President, and Secretary of the Student Body, the student elected members of the Executive Council, the editors of the publications, the elected members of the Student Council and the yell leader shall be nominated on the first Thursday in May and elected by ballot on the second Wednesday in May of each year, and shall hold office as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 2—Length of Office. The officers of this association shall hold office for one year or until such time as their successors shall be regularly elected and this constitution, unless otherwise stipulated in this constitution.

Sec. 3—Rules of Election. The rules under which the elections of this Association shall be conducted shall be those laid down in Article III of the By-Laws.

Sec. 4—Assume Office. The officers of this Association shall be elected by a plurality of votes.

Sec. 6—Oath of Office. "I do hereby solemnly pledge and affirm that I will perform the duties of the office to which I have been elected, as they are set out in the Constitution of the Associated Students, to the best of my ability."

Sec. 7—Recall Elections.

Clause 1. A special Student Body Election, for the recall of any officer of the Association, shall be called by the President of the Student Body at the petition of twenty-five per cent. (25 per cent.) of the members of the Associated Students.

Clause 2. Two-Thirds Majority. At this election it will require a two-thirds (2-3) majority of the votes cast to expel from office the officer or officers in question.

Article X. Finance.

Sec. 1—Dues. The dues of the individual members of the Association shall be twelve dollars per year; payable four dollars at the beginning of each term upon payment of which they shall be entitled to a "Student Season Ticket" admitting them to all University games or contests held on the campus and to such additional games or contests as the Executive Council may order.

A subscription price of seventy-five cents per term for the Oregon Emerald shall be paid by each student at the time of paying the regular registration fee.

Sec. 2—Failure to Pay Dues. Students refusing or failing to pay dues known as the Associated Students' Tax, shall not be eligible to hold office in this Association, vote at its election, or represent it in any manner whatsoever.

Sec. 3—Audit. All records and accounts of the Graduate Manager and the Treasurer of the Associated Students shall be audited annually by an accountant appointed by the Executive Council, to whom he shall make his report. His fee shall be paid out of the general Student Body funds.

Sec. 4—Class Taxes. A regular class tax of \$1.00 shall be collected at registration from each undergraduate student of the University by the Treasurer.

Clause 2. Class Treasurer. The Treasurers of the respective classes shall endorse all bills owing by their respective

classes, and shall issue warrants on the Treasurer to pay the same.

Clause 3. Advisory Committee. Each class shall have an advisory committee, consisting of the President of the class, the Treasurer of the class, and the class adviser.

Clause 4. Duty of Advisory Committee. The duties of the advisory committee shall be to authorize all class expenditures and audit all class accounts.

Sec. 5—Assessments. No provision in this article shall be construed to impair the right of any class to levy such special assessments as they see fit.

Article XI. Meetings.

Sec. 1—Regular. The regular meetings of the Associated Students shall be held on the first Thursday in October, December, March, May and June of each year.

Sec. 2—Special Meetings. Special meetings shall be held upon the call of the President on his own initiative or upon the petition of 200 members; provided that twenty-four hours' notice shall be given before any special meeting.

Sec. 3—Quorum. Three hundred members shall constitute a quorum.

Article XII. Repealing Acts of Officers.

Sec. 1—Any act of any officer, committee or organization, existing under this Constitution may be repealed or amended by a majority of the members present at a regular meeting of the Association.

Article XIII. Historian.

Sec. 1—Appointment. A Historian shall be elected by the Student Council at their last meeting in May.

Sec. 2—Assume Office. The Historian shall assume the duties of the office on the first Wednesday in June and shall take the oath of office with the other newly elected student officers.

Sec. 3—Duties and Powers of Historian. The duties of the Historian shall be as follows: The Historian shall:

Clause 1. Have general supervision over the University museum and historical records.

Clause 2. Keep an accurate record of all athletic contests, debates, concerts, and other student body activities.

Clause 3. Appoint a general committee which shall be comprised of three students and the Historian, who shall have power to appoint the general staff.

Sec. 4—Finances. The finances shall be under the supervision of the Advisory Committee which shall be composed of the President of the University, the University Librarian, the Graduate Manager, and the Secretary to the President of the University. Any expenditure of student funds must first receive the approval of the Executive Council.

Article XIV. Women's League.

Sec. 1—Name. The name of this organization shall be the "Women's League of the University of Oregon."

Sec. 2—Membership. Every woman member of the Associated Students of the University of Oregon shall be a member of the Women's League.

Sec. 3—The Women's League shall adopt its own Constitution subject to the approval of the Student Council.

Sec. 4—The existing affiliation with the State Federation of Women's Clubs shall be endorsed by the Student Council and fees for this membership shall be allowed from student body funds.

Sec. 5—An annual budget shall be

provided for the Women's League by the Executive Council, estimates for which shall be submitted to the finance committee on or before January 15.

Article XV. Amendments.

Sec. 1—Amendments to this Constitution may be proposed in writing at any regular meeting, when they shall be read. The following morning the proposed amendments shall be printed in the "Oregon Daily Emerald" and voted on by ballot within one week later. A two-thirds (2-3) vote of the ballots cast shall be necessary for the adoption of the amendment, provided, however, that there must be at least three hundred (300) ballots cast.

ELECTRIC TIMER INSTALLED.
