

# INTERCLASS TITLE TO BE DECIDED TODAY

## Girl's Junior and Freshman Basketball Teams Meet.

### GAMES TO BE HARD Most of Players Experienced; Admission Free.

The junior and freshmen women's basketball team play for the interclass championship and the Hayward cup in the men's gymnasium at 5 o'clock this afternoon. No admission will be charged and all students are invited to attend. These teams were victorious in the preliminary interclass games Wednesday afternoon. The juniors easily won from the senior team by a 41 to 7 score, but the sophomore-freshmen game was close from the start. The sophomores led by one point at the end of the first half, but the frosh succeeded in throwing the deciding basket and the final score stood 26 to 24 in their favor. The sophomore class won the championship last year, when they were frosh, but lost their chance to hold the cup by losing Wednesday night.

Oletta Pedersen and Helen Nelson, forwards on the junior team, scored consistently, and ran up one of the highest scores of the season. The senior team, however, had never played together before the game Wednesday night, and some of the individual members had not played since freshmen.

The game tonight will be close. All the players but one has played before this season in either varsity or doughnut games. Helen Nelson and Oletta Pedersen were members of the varsity team. Maurine Elrod and Carolyn Cannon, centers, played in the doughnut series, and Sarah Martin, guard was a varsity player and also took part in the doughnut series. Echo Baldarree, guard, is the only member of the junior team not playing in any other team this season.

Against the juniors, will be the Quinn twins, forwards, stars of the Henricks hall doughnut team. Helen King, Edna Largent, centers, and Eloise Harris, Frances Anderson, guards, who played the same positions in the doughnut series. Eloise Harris also played guard on the varsity team. Miss Catharine Winslow will umpire and Miss Laura McAllister will referee the game this afternoon.

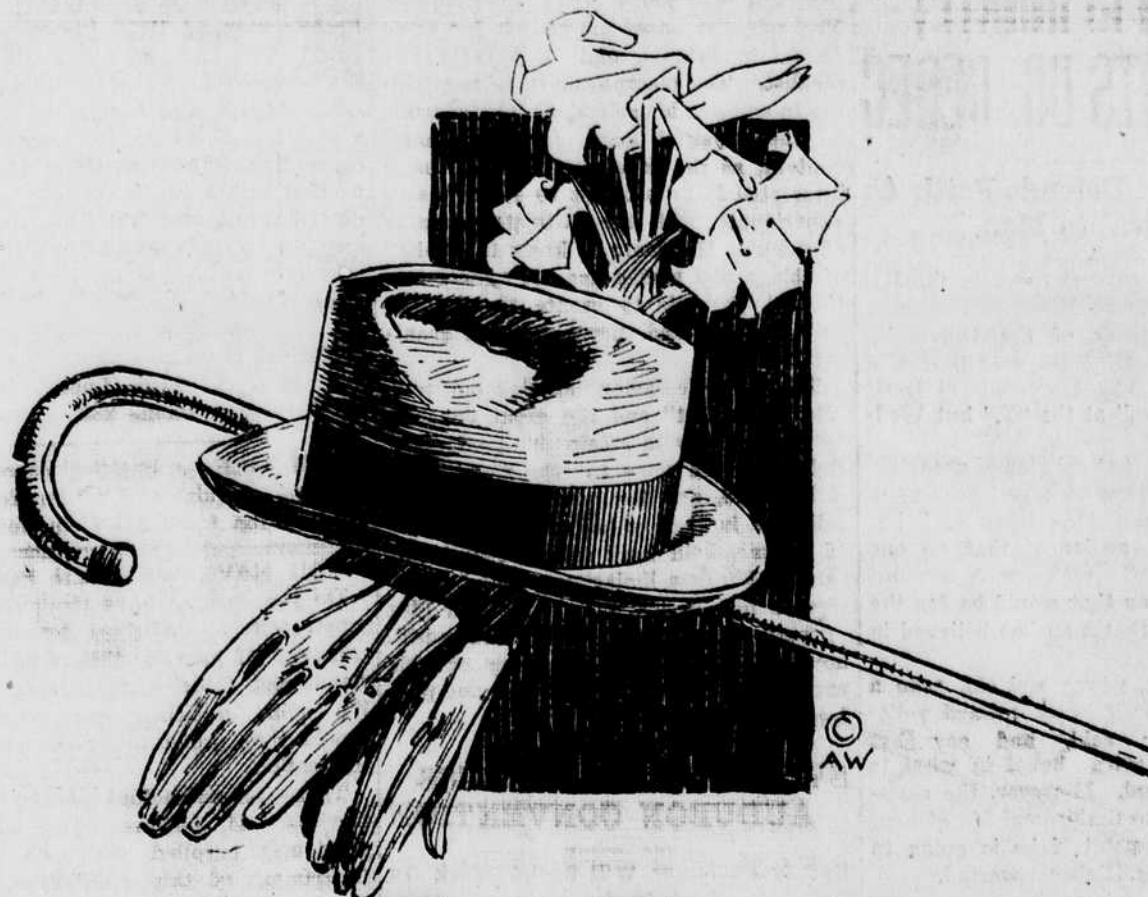
