man to be in charge is not known here. but it is expected that the appointment
bill be made at an early date. This step taken by the Red Cross is the firs thing of the kind to be arranged in con-
nection with a college summer term in nection with a college summer term in
the United States, so far as is known said Mr. Kilpatrick today. It means that everybody attending the
summer term will Be given an opportunity to learn to swim and to swim fo

will be given competent instruction in the saving of a less fortunate person who
