#### TRUSTWORTHY STUDENTS.

Dean Allen, head of the second largest school on the campus, performed an experiment, which if not unique in the annals of education, is at least entitled to thoughful consideration by the other members of the faculty of the University. The dean left the campus several weeks before the close of the term, leaving his classes entirely in the hands of his journalism studnts.

Being principally lecture courses, faculty members and outside speakers delivered lectures before the classes. But the dean even allowed some of his own students to take charge of a class. Students kept the attendance records. Certainly there is a lesson in trust there.

Dean Allen even went further. Instead of giving a final examination in the courses, and engaging some other journalism instructor to take charge of the work, he asked his students to prepare a paper as a substitute for the examination. The paper asked for was the same for each class. There was plenty of opportunity for cheating. But there was no cheating.

"I was immensely gratified," said the dean, "by the interest and application of the students to the work. If ever there is a movement on the part of the student body to take a more active part in the handling of the collegiate work, I shall certainly not oppose it."

Trust reposes in they who trust. It may be cleverness to outwit a distrustful instructor, but it is dishonesty to deceive one who trusts his students.
