have no bearing on the situation. Nine out of ten students will sign any petition circulated by students in behalf of any movement of the sort, regardless of its merits. Those objections to the shortening of the holiday are quick to disdain any motive of getting out of classes and yet it is somewhat singular that no offer has been made to make up this work in any fashion or to guarantee a high quality of work on the days immediately preceding and following the holiday. This fact is unfortunate. The fact that the University of Oregon began the work of the year a week later than at O. A. C. must of course also be taken into consideration.

There is also one other consideration. Instructors coming to the University of Oregon recently from other institutions remark upon the allowance the faculty at Oregon make for student opinion, and some are even unkind enough to say that the faculty has no backbone. It is certain that the readiness with which the students use their influence with the faculty in matters of minor importance and the partisanship displayed as shown by the campaign conducted so energetically through the Emerald is not calculated to increase the respect of the faculty for student fairness and sound judgment.
