

**DR. GILBERT TO ATTEND TAX MEETING IN SALEM**

Faculty Man Named Economic Advisor of Commission by Olcott to Report in 1923

Dr. James H. Gilbert will attend a meeting of the Tax Investigation Commission, to be held in Salem on December 23. The commission was created at the last session of the legislature, and the members appointed by Governor Olcott. Dr. Gilbert is its economic advisor. The five members of the commission are Senator I. M. Day, who is chairman, Charles A. Brand of Roseburg, Judge E. H. Smith, of Lakeview, Coe A. McKenna, of Portland, and Walter M. Pierce of La Grande.

The commission was appointed to investigate the tax system of the state and make recommendations to the legislature in 1923, with regard to changes in the fiscal system of the state. Dr. Gilbert was asked to cooperate with

them in working out the problems, and they have assigned special fields to him. Chief of these are investigation of the corporation tax in this state, relation between income from real estate and the taxes paid by real estate, business tax and the possibility of a state sales tax.

Australia intends to send a tennis team to the United States next summer to compete in the Davis Cup tournament.

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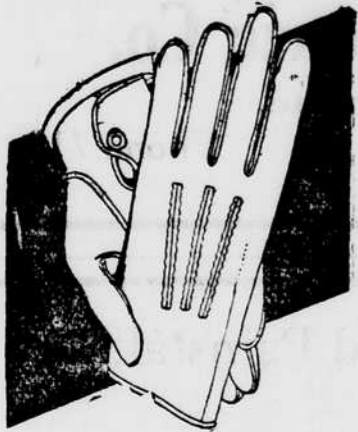
