## COMMERCE SECRETARIES TO TAKE COURSE HERE

### Chamber of Commerce Men To Receive Six Days' Training; Many Already Registered

The University of Oregon will give a special short course for Commercial Club secretaries March 27 to April 1, inclusive. The six days of instruction will cover various subjects that will be of interest to commercial organizations. Ten letters were received today by the Business Administration Office, all but one signifying the intention of some secretary to enroll in the course.

W. A. Reid of Marshfield, president of the State Associations of Commercial Club Secretaries, who will attend the course, said in a recent letter addressed to commercial organizations of Oregon: "I do not exaggerate when I say in my humble opinion it is worth one hundred dollars to any commercial organization to send its secretary to this short course."

A similar course was held here last year and a number of secretaries attended. These men have advertised the course since last Spring and have urged other secretaries to attend.

"The university is a firm believer in the development of the community, and a number of young men are taking a course here to prepare themselves to become secretaries of commercial clubs," says a circular letter issued by the president's office.

Details of the course will be completed in a few days when the registration as well as the curriculum will be announced.
