

**PSYCHOLOGY CLASSES
SHOW HEAVY GROWTH**

Faculty and Students Are Engaged in Various Kinds of Scientific Research Work

Work in the psychology department is progressing rapidly. There has been a 25 per cent increase in the elementary classes and a 35 per cent increase in laboratory classes this year. The laboratory assistants are Thomas Cutsforth, who has been assistant two years, and Florence Riddle, both graduates. The undergraduate assistant is Cecil McAlister.

Research is being carried on by Dr. E. S. Conklin, Dr. H. R. Crosland and Dr. R. H. Wheeler and by five students.

Dr. Conklin is working on the ways and means of getting scientific and adequate measurements of character traits. He has a paper prepared for publication now and some of the pre-

liminary work of his research problem is ready.

Dr. Crosland is working on problems in proof reading and the most common mistakes made in correcting proof. He has lately had an article in the Psychological Review.

Dr. Wheeler is working on the acquisition of skill and the types and attitude of mind working toward efficiency in control of muscular movements. He has had a paper, "The Development of Meaning," in the American Journal of Psychology and is to have one in the next issue of the Psychological Review.

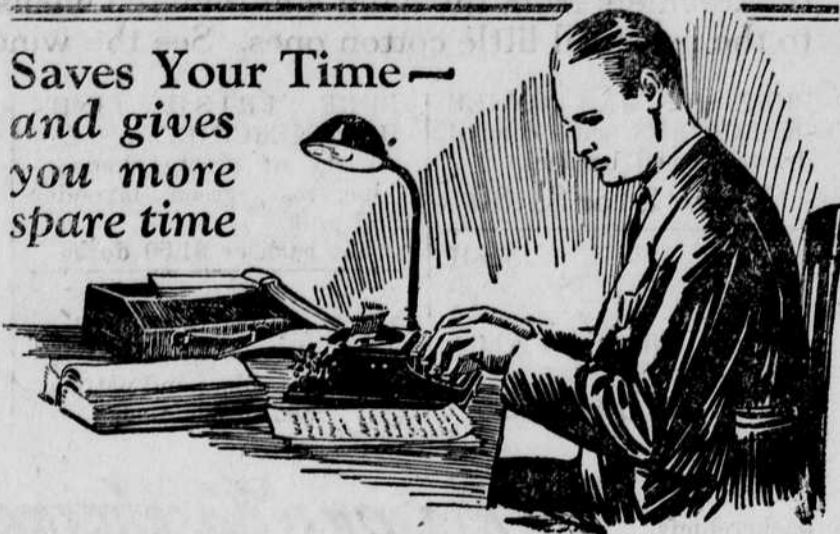

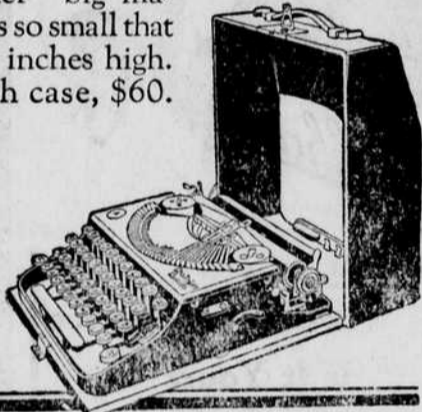
